EYFS Curriculum

In Early Years we follow a play based curriculum which covers 17 areas of learning:-

Number Shape, Space and measure Writing Reading Physical development Health and Self care Understanding the word **People and Comunities Exploring Media and Materials Being Imaginaitive** Speaking Listening and Attention Understanding Self confidence and Self awareness Making relationships Managing feelings and behaviour Technology

EYFS Curriculum

Your child will be assessed in all 17 areas throughout the year through independent work and adult observations.

We create an enabling environment where the children make their own choices and can challenge themselves when they are ready too.

Over the course of the year, the structure of the day may change to prepare children for the Year 1 curriculum.

EYFS end of year expectations!

By the end of the year a typical child will be expected to meet their Early Learning Goals in all 17 areas of the curriculum.

Here is an example of the writing and number ELG criteria.

Writing ELG :- Children use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. They also write some irregular common words. They write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Some words are spelt correctly and others are phonetically plausible.

Number ELG:- Children count reliably with numbers from one to 20, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. Using quantities and objects, they add and subtract two single-digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer. They solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.



In Reception we use a number of strategies to promote positive behaviour.

We use verbal praise, stickers and praise certificates. We also follow the whole school policy of the traffic light system and the house point system.

Children will be rewarded for positive behaviour and outstanding learning by moving onto bronze, silver and gold!







Pre - Cursive writing



As a school we have decided to take a different approach to handwriting this year. This is to improve the standard of handwriting across the school. In Reception the children will be taught to form each letter with a 'WOOSH' at the beginning. Here is an example:-

a b c

Letter shapes will be taught through phonics and short daily English sessions, they will also be encouraged when children are accessing the activities independently. This approach will be phased in throughout the year. A list of the NEW letter rhymes is available on the information table, please take one!



In Reception we have a "Reach for the stars" display. This is to celebrate children's achievements at home in school. A different coloured star will be sent home each half term for parents/ careers to write on their child's achievement. We would like to share with you some example comments that would be suitable for the 'reach for the stars' display. The stars should comment on something <u>new</u> the children are able to do or something that has proved challenging that they are proud of.

- When writing in sentences ***** is remembering to use finger spaces. Well done!
- ***** swam a width at swimming at the weekend with no arm bands. Mum and Dad are so proud!

2Simple – 2 build a profile


Aspects contributed to by this experience:

- Counts an irregular arrangement of up to ten objects. Mathematics>Numbers>40-60 months
- Counts objects to 10, and beginning to count beyond 10.
 Mathematics>Numbers>40-60 months
- Selects the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 10 objects. Mathematics>Numbers>40-60 months

Rolling Snack & Water bottles



This year the children can access a snack area that is in the classroom throughout the day. It is up to your child to decide when they would like their snack. They pour their own drink and help themselves to a piece of fruit. This promotes independence and some of the curriculum areas such as health and self care & self confidence and self awareness.

If your child would like <u>Juice, this is £1 a week</u> and can be paid to a member of staff on a Monday morning in a sealed envelope with your child's name on and amount. Alternatively you can pay for a half term at £6 each time.

Water bottles

Water bottles should only have water in them as this is school policy, children can access their water bottles at any point during the school day! Bottles come home every day to be washed and refilled.









P.E takes place on a FRIDAY morning. Children are expected to wear full PE kit which includes shorts, pumps and a white t- shirt. In the winter we may ask for jogging bottoms to be sent in as well.

We encourage the children to undress and dress themselves as this is part of the curriculum. We would appreciate your support at home with this as some children find this difficult.

Homework Menus

Homework is completed by you and your child choosing from our homework menu. Here is an example! The school expectation is that 3 are completed each half term. You will find the menus on the website & we will also send a paper copy home in their homework book. ALL homework will come back to school during the last week of term and a new menu will be given.
