Phonics





- Daily phonics session.
- Spelling of the common exception words is a big focus in the end of Key Stage One SATs.
- If there are any specific gaps they may come home with a game or sheet.
- They will be tested in June 2020.
- There will be a phonic workshop on Monday 18th November.



Assessment in Year Two





- Assessment is ongoing throughout the year.
- At the end of Year 2 there is a formal assessment to measur where the children are at the end of Key Stage One nationally.
- Children will be tested on reading comprehension, Maths and Arithmetic.
- Children will also be formally assessed on their writing and will also be assessed in Science.
- Children will be prepared for these tests.
- To be administered during May 2019.
- There will be a SATs workshop on Thursday 21st November.
