Topic: The Wild Wild West

Term: Summer 1

Set Menu: Timetables, spellings, daily reading, phonics practice

We will be looking for children to be reading at home with their parents. Listening to children read will enable them to grow in confidence as they become fluent readers. Once children are able to read fluently, and with expression, we would encourage you to hold discussions around their comprehension of the texts (we will provide a bank of ideas to support this). If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books. We want them to foster a love of books, so please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

Added Extras:

We will encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in our homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

Read it

Can you find and read some limericks? You might find them in poetry books or on the internet. Maybe you have family members who know some limericks and could write them down for you. You can either take a photograph of you reading them for your book or write some of the limericks in there.

Research it

Research what life was like in The Wild West. How did people there live? What were their homes like? What did they eat? You can show your findings in any way you choose such as a poster, a report, a power point or even a letter.



Design it

Design your own prairie schooner. They were used as transport and homes so consider everything that the Native Americans would have needed.



Practise it

During this half term we will be learning more about fractions and how we can add and subtract these. Once you have learnt this in class, have another go.
