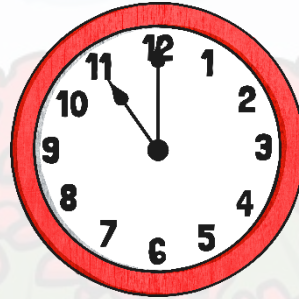
What Is Remembrance Day?
