If your child is reluctant to read, they could listen to audio books. We want them to foster a love of books, so please don't underestimate the value of reading to your child. We are all very grateful for your support.

**Added Extras:**

We will encourage your child to complete as many of the activities from the menu as they like at home, but NO LESS than 3 over the half term, This can be recorded (if appropriate) in our homework books. We will ask for homework books in during the last week of each half term in order for us to share and celebrate this learning.

Practise grid multiplication and the bus shelter method of division.</p> <p>Can you write and solve your own multiplication and division word problems? (If you would like us to provide you with some examples, please ask.)</p>	<p>Write an advertisement or leaflet persuading people to join the Roman Army.</p> <p>Think about how you will encourage them to want to protect their empire, and what skills they will need to join the army.</p>	<p>Create your own version of the Roman Colosseum.</p> <p>You could draw and label your Colosseum, or make it from any materials. If you are drawing, you need to make sure your colosseum is labelled!</p>



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
