English	<p>Our new text for this week is all about an Alien who comes down to Earth and struggles to find some friends.</p> <div style="display: flex; align-items: flex-start;">  <div> <p>Think about this picture of the alien.</p> <p>Is it a boy or girl? Where do you think they are? What time of day is it? Can you describe the character? What do you think they are looking at? What does their expression tell us?</p> </div> </div>

	<p>Today you are going to think about the alien in the picture and decide what it might be like. Use the word mat below and either put a circle around the words or tell an adult which words describe the alien. You don't need to write them. Can you think of any other adjectives that might describe the alien? (Adults you may need to help with the reading of these words☺)</p>	 <p>questions to ask about the alien. Share some questions with your adult verbally and remember to say question mark to remind you!</p>	 <p>think about question and statement sentences. Share some sentences with your adult verbally can they identify which type of sentence it is?</p>
Maths	<p style="text-align: center;">This week we are starting a new topic on MONEY.</p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;"><i>NB: Parents- We haven't looked at this yet in Year 1 but I thought it would be good to start at home ☺ If you can, get together a set of different value coins for your child to sort and look at, some children may not have had much opportunity to do so.</i></p>

	<p>Ask your grown up if they can let you have some coins today to look at and sort into sets.</p> <p>Can you sort the coins into pence, pounds? Which coins are round? silver? bronze? Can you describe what a 5p looks like? What is the same / different about each coin? What value does 10p have? How many 1ps in 5p? 10p? How many 2ps in 10p? There is no worksheet today.</p>	<p>Ask your grown up if they can let you have some coins today to look at and sort into sets.</p> <p>When you have looked at each coin, sort them into order by value/ what each coin is worth. This is tricky as smaller coins may be worth more than bigger coins so ask a grown up to check with you. You can use the sheet below to help you if you like or you can do it practically with actual coins.</p>	<p>Ask your grown up if they can let you have some coins today to look at and sort into sets.</p> <p>When you have looked at each coin, sort them into order by the value of each coin. Remember small coins are not necessarily worth less than bigger coins. If you can do this try the sheet below, if you can't print just write down the value of the coins in order. Remember to write 'p' for pence at the end and £ at the start for pound.</p>

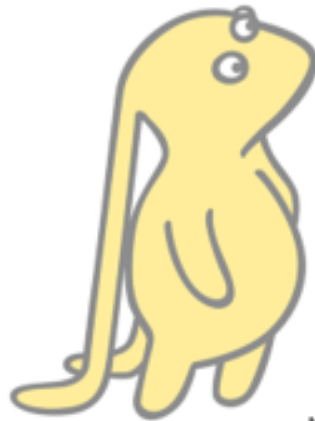
