
Creative

Create a minibeast using natural materials from outdoors.






You could use the flashcards from task







All about Worms

Worms are long and thin. They do not have arms or legs. Worms have lots and lots of little rings around their body. These are called segments.

Worms have tiny hairs all along their body. These help the worm to move through the soil. Earthworms use their skin to breathe. They don't have lungs like many other animals.

They need to stay moist to stay alive.

Worms eat dead leaves, plants, flowers and old fruit and vegetables.

Worms help to mix layers of the soil together. They burrow under the ground, making tunnels which helps to move the soil around.

They help to break down dead plants and flowers.

Baby worms hatch from tiny cocoons. Worms don't have eyes but can sense light. They like to live in cool, dark, damp places.
