Dear Parents,

It's been lovely to receive the children back to school after the half-term break and we have had some fantastic attitudes towards learning with children really being ambitious and trying their best and pushing boundaries. This is great to see.

During the Covid pandemic, the local authority have been providing regular Teams meetings for head teachers so we are fully informed about any local issues and national guidance. This week there has been a lot of discussion around the Covid outbreak in Leek in highlight of the Indian Delta variant being spread within the community and being more transmissible. Much of the transmission in Leek appeared to be happening during social events outside the school day, where Covid controls were not in place. The advice from the local authority is that with the warmer weather and more people mixing both indoors and outside, it is more important than ever that we remain vigilant and stick to the rules to stop the virus spreading further.

Unfortunately the Covid risk assessment is still very much in place and consequently the normal end of year activities will be amended to comply with the Covid guidance and keep the Kingsfield community safe. We will ensure that the children don't miss out on anything as we are finding Covid safe ways of ensuring the transition events, sports day, Y4 leavers performance etc. still go ahead safely and are enjoyed. Unfortunately there can be no spectators for sports day and no audience for the Y4 leavers. We will however make every effort to tweet videos and photos for sports day and the Year 4 leavers show will being fully recorded.

On a brighter note, the weather is gorgeous at the moment, so please send children with water, sun hats and applied sun cream prior to school. Only send sun cream in with your child if they are able to apply it themselves and please name the bottle as it must not be shared.
