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### Homework

In response to a mixed engagement with homework previously set and with feedback on the annual survey, the staff have met this week to review the homework offer. To get ready for this, your child will be coming home with their homework book for them to decorate/personalised the cover in order to make it that extra bit special. This book must be returned to school by next Friday in readiness for their exciting homework projects - more information will follow.

To begin with though, we want homework to focus on the basics – these being learning letter sounds (phonics), reading, spellings and number facts. Being secure here provides the bedrock on success.

We expect reading to be completed at home 3 times per week and the home school links book, signed by an adult to indicate completion of this. Once completed we will be rewarding reading engagement along with children's reading efforts in school.

Weekly spellings are to be learned from Y2 upwards and letter sounds (phonics) need to be practised from Nursery to Year 2. Letter sounds and spellings will be taught, tested and success rewarded in school.

In maths you will be informed of which number bonds or times tables to practise and success here will be tracked using the pages in the Home School links books and Times Tables tracker in the classrooms.

Other subject based projects will be set throughout the year which will be optional and in addition to the above homework basics. More information here will follow, but for now we are looking for children to really focus on reading, letter sounds, spellings and number.

A little practise every night we will make a big difference long term. We value your support with homework.
